

## Actual Crime vs. Crime Rate

Currently, Parsons is the 37th largest community in Kansas, but the 58th Largest Law enforcement agency **based on population**. The last couple of years there has been a drop in the resident population even as the City has seen growth in economic growth.

As resident population shrinks even as employment grows and the city has more people working in the city, that can have an impact on the City's statistical crime per capita numbers.

So while the per capita crime rate for Parsons is listed as (2023 KBI-NIBRS Report):


Crime prevention involves much more than mere random patrolling by the police. Crime is affected by:

- Broken Families Lack of Safety Nets (family, friends, faith) Parental Criminality Neglect and Family Violence



- Lock your doors
- Install security / motion lighting
- Keep valuables out of vehicles
- Throw boxes away from new purchases day of trash pickup such as televisions and computers
- Keep records of serial numbers for valuable equipment
- Install security cameras and alarms
- Know your neighbors and watch each others property
